Communications Update

Remind 101 is our communication platform that we will be using along with FACTS (RenWeb) to send school communications to all our families. While routine communications such as newsletters and updates will be our main source for sending communication, emergencies and reminders will be sent through Remind 101, which will send a notification to you via text message. If you have been receiving emails from our school through FACTS (RenWeb), then your contact information will have been uploaded into our school Remind 101, meaning you are signed up and good to go. Our school's Remind101 account is now up and running, so you will now be receiving these messages more frequently. Classes have been set up, and teachers have added all our parents to their classes. More communication groups will be added throughout the year as we assimilate to using this communication platform. If you are not receiving communications through text message, and would like to,

we are happy to add you so that you can be included on our school communications. Please contact Mrs. Couture or me in the office and we will be happy to assist. Thank you for your patience throughout this process. We hope that this will increase our school communications and keep all our Baraga families connected throughout the year.
